

"Frosty the Snowman"...

Students are encouraged to play in the snow and to make snowmen, but snowballs are not allowed. Please reinforce this rule with your child. Please ensure your child is properly dressed for the weather with mitts, hats and snow pants.

"Oh the Weather Outside is Frightful..."

Please send indoor shoes with your children during these winter months and a change of clothes for students in all grades. Our hallways are often wet and students in stocking feet will be uncomfortable. A change of clothes is also suggested in case of accidents.

Decisions about when to hold indoor recess are dictated by weather conditions and common sense. The decision may vary from grade to grade. If the temperature falls below -20C with the wind chill factored in, students are to remain indoors. Also, if the school yard condition is icy we stay inside due to safety reasons.

"Jingle Bells"

School begins at 8:55am each morning. Children should be allowed sufficient time to arrive promptly. Parking before & after school continues to be on the street. Kiss & Drop Off to be used by students who are independent to exit a vehicle on their own so the parent can drive away promptly so not to interfere with bus drop off or pick up.

"I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas"...

We are a **Zone 2** school. Details about inclement weather conditions and school closures can be found on the board's website (www.bhncdsb.ca) or by listening to 820 CHAM, 900 CHML, 1150 CKOC, or watching channel 11 news. If the buses are cancelled the school is CLOSED. SCHOOL STAFF are not available and the doors will be locked. Never drop off your child or send them to school without checking if we are open.

SAFETY FIRST

Please drive carefully when dropping off and picking up your child(ren). Remember to give yourself ample time as the snowy road conditions may impact the parking availability around the school.

At 3:15pm students are dismissed out their own doors in an orderly fashion and under the supervision of their teachers.

"Jolly Old St. Nit..."

Tis the season for unwanted lice and/or nits. Please check your child's hair regularly/routinely. Early detection helps to minimize the risk of this spreading at home and at school as well.

Helpful Tip: Olive oil will suffocate the lice/nits if left on for 4 hours, then washed out. It is imperative that it is left on for 4 hours, as they can survive after only 3 hours without air. We appreciate your vigilance.



Dear Parent or Guardian,

The Dental Program from the Haldimand Norfolk Health Unit will be coming to your child's school for dental screening.

WHO?

- JK, SK, 2, 7 and some selected students in other grades
- If your child is not in one of the grades listed above but you want them to be screened, please click on this link https://hnhu.org/schoolscreening/ or call the Health Unit, Dental Program Ext. 3293.

WHAT?

- The screening is a quick look in the mouth. It is done by a Registered Dental Hygienist. A separate sterilized dental mirror is used for each
- If your child has cavities or would benefit from other dental services, a letter will be sent home in their backpack.
- Your child may be screened again at a later date. This is part of the dental screening follow-up process.
- Our school screenings **DO NOT** replace visits with your family dentist.
- If you are worried about your child's mouth you do not need to wait for the school visit please contact the Health Unit, Dental Program Ext. 3293

WHY?

To find children who need to see a dentist.

SK **Students**

Only

- To offer support for children who cannot afford dental services.
- To link families with other Public Health Services.
- This is a mandatory program under the Health Protection and Promotion

Act, Section 7

ISION SCREENING

- Approximately 1 in 4 school age children may have vision problems
- Children need healthy eyes to learn, read and stay safe
- Vision screenings are mandatory for students in Senior Kindergarten (SK) under the Ontario Public Health Standards

- All SK students will receive vision screening
- Vision screenings are conducted by trained Lions Club volunteers

IMPORTANT: If you wish to opt out of vision screening for your child please go to www.hnhu.org/school-screening or call 519-426-6170 ext. 3285 no later than

December 4, 2023

WHAT?

- Vision screening consists of three easy eye tests to identify risk factors for eye disorders such as:
 - Lazy eye
 - Eye turn
 - Nearsightedness and farsightedness
- The vision screening takes about 15 minutes to complete
- Your child will bring home a letter with their results in their backpack
- This vision screening does not replace your child's regular checkup with your eye doctor or family doctor. Your child should still receive a full eye exam by an eye doctor. Children can receive a yearly eye exam, free of charge until the age of 19.

WHERE?

- Vision screening will take place at your child's school during school hours
- Alternatively, you may take your child to an eye doctor for a free eye exam

If you have any concerns with your child's eye health, please contact your eye doctor or family doctor. You do not have to wait for the school screening visit. If you do not have an eye doctor, please visit findaneyedoctor.ca to find one near you.


