We rejoice in you.



If you've missed a call from the school, please ensure you listen to your voice mail, so you know who called and what it was about before calling the school back. Those details are important as staff could be making calls from anywhere in the school, and the front office won't necessarily be aware of it.

#### **Late Arrivals & Early Departures**

Promptness & regularity are necessary attendance traits that contribute to a child's overall success at school. When students arrive late or leave early, they are disrupting school and classroom routines, missing out on receiving classroom instruction & important information.

Children will not be called from class for early dismissal prior to a parent/guardian's arrival as there is no one to supervise them outside of their classrooms. Please build this into your timeline.

#### Calls to the School

Last minute dismissal changes must be called in before 2:30pm. The office cannot guarantee that new details will be received and teaching staff are unable to check emails for changes. It is best if your child is aware of the end of day plan (taking bus, pick up, etc.) before they start the school day.

#### Are you SUBSCRIBED to Receive the Latest Updates for your Child's Bus Route?

Visit transinfobhn.ca and click on the Parent Portal Link. If you are a first-time user, click on Create Account beside the Log In button. You can create a new account by providing the portal with an email address and password. The system will email you a verification notice (check your junk email folder in case the message was flagged by your email provider).

Once you have verified your email address, go back to the Parent Portal and use both credentials to log in. Once logged in, you can add your child(ren) to your account by clicking on Add Student (you will need to have your child(ren)'s OEN\* available, Street Number (just the number), the school's name and your child's grade. \*Contact the office if you need any information.

We appreciate your patience as Student Transportation continues to experience delays with many routes due to bus driver shortages, etc. The school does not have the information about your child's bus route. By subscribing to the website, you will always have up-to-date information.

A valuable bus tracking app which is now available to parents is the **Chipmunk app**, accessible in both the Apple App Store as well as the Google Play Store. Available on systems which run in iOS and Android platforms and entirely free of charge. Detailed information on how to access, login and use the app are available by visiting www.stsbhn.ca/fags



## **Eye Health**


Did you know that all children and youth, 17 years and younger are eligible for free eye exams in Ontario?

- Vision problems are common among school-aged children but are not always easy for parents to detect.
- Vision problems can lead to challenges in school, play and every day activities
- The Health Unit offers school-based vision screening to senior kindergarten students each year.
- Vision screening does not replace the need for a full exam by an eye doctor.


#### Halloween Fun


<u>Tuesday</u>, October 31<sup>st</sup> is Halloween Fun Day!
