CURRICULUM CORNER

HOME READING:

Please read daily with your child. **Students are encouraged to continue to read daily during the summer months.** They should re-tell the story to you in order to work on their comprehension of the story. Encourage them to tell you the beginning, middle and end of the story. Encourage them to use transition words to connect their ideas: ex. First, next, then, after that, finally, etc.

WRITING:

Students will continue to work on writing a paragraph that includes a topic sentence, supporting details and a concluding sentence. **Students may wish to write in a journal during the summer months to practice their writing skills. In their journal entries, students may wish to write paragraphs focusing on including a topic sentence, supporting sentences with details (at least 3 supporting details) and a concluding sentence.**

MATH:

Students will be working on Patterning and Algebra for their last unit in math for Grade 3. They will use all of the strategies and new learning they have done this year to help them solve math equations, to continue a given pattern and to create their own patterns.

MATHLETICS:

Students have been given their own username and password for Mathletics. This is a math program which the students can access at home on the computer. Students access this program once a week in our daily math program.

Students are encouraged to continue to practice math facts during the summer to increase their speed and accuracy. Students should review addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts.
