

TELEPHONES / CELL PHONES

Please note that cell phones are NOT allowed on school property. This is a Board policy. If necessary, your child can have access to the phone in the office. We will not accept any messages via a cell phone – i.e., child showing teacher a message from their parent on their cell phone. Please make all arrangements before school.

Tell your child where to go after school prior to coming to school. We are not always available at the end of the day to receive new dismissal plans and ensure they are relayed in a timely manner. We would appreciate that your children understand these arrangements before coming to school.

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

This program is in place to ensure the safety of all our children. If your child is to be absent, please call the school or send a note with another family member or friend. Where we have not been notified, we shall call to verify our attendance records. If your child is unwell, please keep him/her home for the day, reducing the risk of spreading germs in the classroom.

ADMINISTRATION OF PRESCRIBED MEDICATION

We, at Notre Dame, must follow Board policies & procedures for the administration of medication during school hours. If needed, please contact the principal for information about arranging the administration of medication. Authorization to provide such service must be made in writing by the parent and physician on the appropriate form (obtained at the school). Only prescription drugs will be administered. Non-prescription drugs such as aspirin (or other over-the-counter medication) will NOT be administered to the students.

PICK UP & DROP OFF OF CHILDREN - SAFETY PRECAUTION

Parents cannot park on school property. Please find a parking spot on the street if you wish to walk your child to the front of the school or use the Kiss & Ride area. Parking is not permitted at the Canadian Tire parking lot, nor on the boulevard across from the school (complaints of damage to the grass were received from the condominium unit in past years). Staff supervision begins at 8:40am and children should not arrive before that time as there will not be supervision on school grounds. *Staff will be outside the school to receive children who arrive by bus. Parents are asked not to congregate on school property after dropping off your child before school or while waiting for the dismissal bell at the end of the day. It helps to foster an easier transition for the child in the morning and eliminate disruptions to classes who are still receiving instruction in the classroom until 3:15pm (when parents are standing near the classroom windows and can be seen by students inside.) Parents/guardians must not enter the school at any entry door other than through the main entrance. All visitors/volunteers must sign in at the office.

CHANGE OF CLOTHES

It is important that <u>ALL</u> students JK to Grade 8 have a change of clothes at the school. This will prevent students from having to call a parent at home or at work and inconveniencing them during the day.

DRESS CODE

Appropriate dress is required at all times. As a Catholic School, one of our goals is to promote modesty in dress and decency in behaviour. In order to do this, certain types of clothing are not acceptable at Notre Dame –

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOT TO BE WORN TO SCHOOL:

* Cut off shorts (short shorts) * Tube tops/spaghetti straps *Any tops displaying midriff

*Tshirts with inappropriate slogans/pictures

Any attire offensive or immodest is not permitted. As a sign of respect, hats are not to be worn inside the school.

LUNCHES (Reminder: Notre Dame is a Nut FREE School)

Should you have to drop off your child's lunch, please ensure the package is clearly labelled with your child's name. Please pack any utensils with your child's lunch. The office nor the teacher has spoons, straws, cups, etc. available for the students. Students will not have access to microwaves to warm up their food. **Ensure your child can open their own containers.** Thank you.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE POLICY AT NOTRE DAME SCHOOL

It's a fact: a healthy mind depends on a healthy body. Students who eat healthy food are better prepared to learn and are more likely to succeed in school. Please remember that the students have 2 breaks — two 40-minute breaks. Perhaps mark what they should eat at first and second break.

The Ministry of Education has a School Food and Beverage Policy that includes comprehensive nutrition standards. As part of this initiative, the Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board has created its own Interim Policy that aligns with the ministry policy.

Any food sold/served (ie. pizza & milk program) at Notre Dame School will meet the guidelines outlined in our board policy. Notre Dame will provide a healthy school eating environment that encourages and models healthy living.

As in the past, home baking is not allowed due to Health Unit Guidelines and the anaphylactic policy. In case of a birthday, perhaps send in a book to be added to the classroom library.

If allowed this year, schools will be able to choose ten special events that do not have to follow the policy. These ten days will be decided by the principal, in consultation with the staff.

Good health is a prerequisite for good learning. The School Food and Beverage Policy offers a way to encourage healthy eating in schools. For more information about Ontario's healthy schools initiatives, visit www.ontario.ca/healthyschools



SCHOOL FIELD TRIPS

When school trips are permitted throughout the year, detailed information and permission forms will be sent home for parents/guardians.

LICE CHECKS

Lice doesn't take a holiday. Please check your child's head on a regular basis and let us know should you find any nits. We have a "No Nit Policy."

PERSONAL INVITATIONS FOR BIRTHDAYS/PARTIES

We cannot allow the distribution of any invitations in the classroom for birthday parties, etc. during the school day. When some children do not receive invites, it causes disruption in the classroom, resulting in hurt feelings, etc. Thank you for your understanding.

VOLUNTEERS & POLICE CHECKS

The Criminal Background Check and Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) process has changed and has become strictly an online process. Parents/Guardians who wish to offer their time and volunteer at the school or on a field trip when needed must obtain a VSC through the opp.ca website. Email the school office (cwoods@bhncdsb.ca) with the following information: FULL legal name (first, middle, last) and your date of birth. A school letter will be prepared and sent to you via email. Additionally, A.O.D.A. training is required, a one-time online training module to be completed by the parent/guardian.

SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS

Students are issued textbooks and workbooks and they have a responsibility to take care of these items. Teachers will expect a textbook to be returned at the end of a unit or school year. Damaged or lost books will have to be replaced.

MONITORING OF SCHOOL VISITORS

Because the security and safety of all our students are important, parents/guardians MUST **report to the office** when entering the school. This includes Board personnel.

The school will be locked, and parents/visitors will enter the front door. Please use the buzzer and the speaker to identify yourself. There will be NO travel through the school by any visitors granted entry to the school.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE FORMS

Our School Board does not provide accident insurance coverage for student injuries that occur on school property or during school activities, including extra-curricular sports.

Each year, many families are left financially unprotected when their children are injured at school, while participating in non-school activities or at home. If a student is injured, parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any costs not covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) or their employer's health care plan. Please check with your provider regarding your coverage.

Most accident-related expenses are not fully covered under OHIP and some expenses like ambulance fees, casts, crutches, physiotherapy and emergency dental care are usually not covered at all. This leaves you, the parent/guardian, financially responsible.

To help protect your family, it is recommended that you consider obtaining student accident insurance. As a convenience to you, the Board has arranged to offer student accident insurance through insuremykids. Participation is voluntary, but highly recommended, and the costs are to be paid by the parent/guardian. The program is available for students up to age 26.


Coverage is provided for a wide range of accidental expenses such as:

- Dental Expenses includes 10 years unlimited dental benefit coverage, future dental up to \$1,650 per tooth, and injury-related orthodontia coverage up to \$2,500 per accident.
- Total and Permanent Disability up to \$350,000.
- Loss of Limb/Loss of Sight, Hearing, or Speech.
- Accidental Death.
- Ambulance Fees.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Special precautions are being taken to ensure your child safely travels to school every day. Your child's safety is our concern, and their best behaviour is necessary. Every time that the bus driver's attention is averted from the road to speak to students who aren't behaving properly, there is a potential situation for an accident. It is a privilege NOT a right to ride the school bus. Students are responsible to the Principal for his/her behaviour on the bus. Inappropriate behaviour will NOT be tolerated, and students will be responsible for his/her actions and will be dealt with accordingly.

Please remind your child about the importance of proper behaviour on the bus. Only students who follow the conduct code of behaviour for riding the bus will be allowed to continue to ride. Please note that no student will be allowed to get off or on at another stop due to the transportation policy and insurance purposes. There will be no exceptions to this rule, (for example babysitting purposes, birthday parties, etc.)

If you have any questions regarding your child's bus, please call the transportation department (519-751-7532 or 1-877-226-6353 – ext.#3). *The school is unaware of daily issues such as bus delays, etc. The school receives email updates just like parents would if they are subscribed to the transportation website (www.stsbhn.ca). Please DO NOT call the school.

TRANSPORTATION PORTAL

Transportation details **for the coming school year** will be communicated to students in Junior/Senior Kindergarten and students identified by the Special Education Department only. All other students will be required to login to the online portal available at www.stsbhn.ca. From the Home Page you can choose Parent/Student Log In. You must create an account allowing you access to your child's Transportation details. The information required is:

- Ontario Education Number (OEN) i.e., 123-456-789). Dashes need to be included. This number can be found on your child's report card, at the top of the first page.
- Date of birth (i.e., dd/mm/yyyy).
- Street Number enter in the actual number (not the street name).
- School select from drop down menu the school the student will be attending.

The portal is now accessible to the public, with information for the 2022-23 school year available to parents/guardians.





NO CHILD WITHOUT

Our school is involved in the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation's No Child Without program. There is no cost for students who attend our school and are between the ages of 7 up to their 14th birthday to join MedicAlert through this program. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis, then you should consider this program. A child's MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur. If your child is already part of the No Child Without program and there have been changes to their medical condition, medications or emergency contact information, call MedicAlert at 1-800-668-1507 to update your child's file.

CODE OF CONDUCT

When you enroll your child in a Catholic School within the Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board, there are clear expectations about acceptable and non-acceptable behaviour for all members of the school community (students, staff, parents and visitors). These expectations will reflect Catholic values including respect for personal dignity, personal space, personal property and difference in background. If you have any concerns as a parent, please address them to your child's teacher. Often you will hear another side to a story or sometimes students may misunderstand the teacher. Please remember to role model proper behaviour. Inappropriate remarks, yelling, swearing at a staff member will not be tolerated!!! Sometimes we may not always agree so it is imperative to talk to the teacher. If the conflict can't be resolved, please talk to the Principal. It is also wise not to discuss staff members in front of the children.

A legal-size pink page, information on BOTH sides, must be reviewed by a parent, any corrections added to the form, and signed by the parent on the second page. All forms are due back to the school immediately as this is a time sensitive request. Kindly return the form with your child in his or her backpack. Thanking you in advance.

Additional mandatory consent forms required annually will be made available to you through School Cash Online in digital format for your convenience. You will be notified once the forms are available to access online.



Direction of School Support

School Support Designation

As a property owner in Ontario, you are required to support a school board, even if you do not have children or your children are not currently attending school. By default, your school support is directed to your municipality's English Public School Board.

In the case of a residential property occupied by tenants, they can direct the school support for that property.

Property owners, occupants, and tenants can select which school board they choose to support. Additionally, you will be able to vote in the next municipal election for trustees for the school board that you choose to support.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is legislatively required to collect school support information and provide it in the assessment roll to every municipality and school board.

Changing your school support online



Based on your eligibility, property owners and tenants registered with MPAC can view and update the school support designation online.
